



## **Safer Together**

Before sending your child to Park Shore Country Day Camp, we want to make sure you understand that in light of the current medical, legal and economic conditions resulting from the COVID 19 pandemic, and recognizing that these conditions are subject to abrupt change at any time, you are sending your child to camp under the following conditions. This Safety Together Form is in addition to all of the terms that are on our regular camp enrollment form.

1. While we wish that we could control every possible risk, and while we will use our best efforts to keep your child safe from the COVID 19 virus, we want to make clear that we cannot promise or guarantee that this or any other pathogen will not enter camp, and that by the very nature of the personal interaction that takes place in the camp environment, there is always a risk of your child becoming ill with this or any other communicable disease. We want you to be fully aware of this risk in making the decision to send your child to camp this summer, and that you are willing to assume and accept it on your child's behalf.
2. Our efforts to keep your child safe include minimizing contact with anyone outside of the camp community. To that end we will not be allowing any in-person visitation during the summer. Although we understand the importance of a traditional visiting day to you and your child, the safety of our camp community must come first and are confident you understand the need to follow this protocol. We greatly appreciate your understanding and will work hard to create a fun, loving, and exciting camp environment for all of our campers.
3. We believe in our ability to open camp this summer in a manner that meets our camp's as well as CDC safety standards. Although guidelines for testing are changing rapidly, we are planning to have every camper take their temperature each day for 14 days before their session begins and record on our Pre-Camp Health Screening Form. Temperatures cannot exceed 100 and campers must be symptom-free. In order to fast track this process campers can take a COVID 19 test one week before their session begins in addition to recording their temperature for 7 days on our Pre-Camp Health Screening Form. Temperatures cannot exceed 100 and there needs to be a negative COVID test result and the camper needs to be symptom-free. This process is important to achieving our health goals for this summer.
4. Because we want to do everything to keep camp operating in a safe manner, if your child is exhibiting symptoms such as an elevated fever of over 100 or exhibits symptoms related to COVID 19 or other communicable disease, they may be quarantined as recommended by our medical staff. Depending upon the medical advice we receive, you may be required to make immediate arrangements to pick up your child. We understand the hardship this could present, but we want to do all we can to assure the safety of both your child and the rest of the camp population.

5. If your child has been in contact with anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of or who has COVID 19, you must contact us immediately, so that we may decide on an appropriate protocol.
6. Transportation of your child to and from camp presents a special challenge for the summer of 2020. After consultation with our medical staff and other experts, campers will be required to travel to and from camp by parent transportation for the morning arrival and for the afternoon pick up. Camper's temperatures will be taken in your car each day before entering camp and cannot exceed 100 during these times.
7. Due to social distancing protocols and keeping campers separated from each other there will be NO BEFORE and/or AFTERCARE for this summer. We understand that this could create a hardship for some of our families, but after very careful review it was nearly impossible to organize this service without jeopardizing the safety of our campers.
8. Parents and guardians agree to act as Park Shore's partners in keeping safety as their top priority. You agree to follow all of the social distance guidelines and use of face coverings as recommended by our Governor. In this way, we can work together whether at home or at camp to keep our campers safe.
